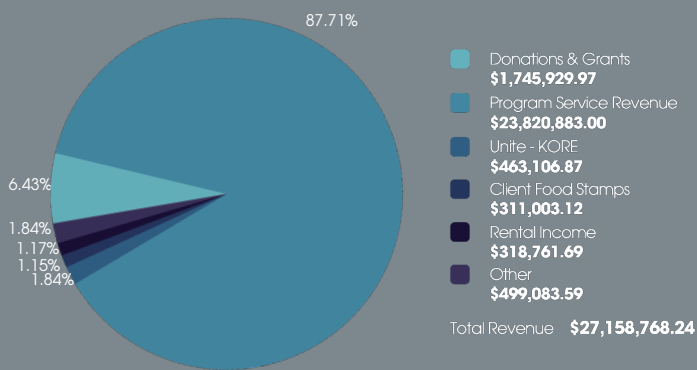
Vision

The vision of Isaiah House is to be the mission leader in equipping individuals with the resources to achieve lifelong recovery while restoring families & improving communities.

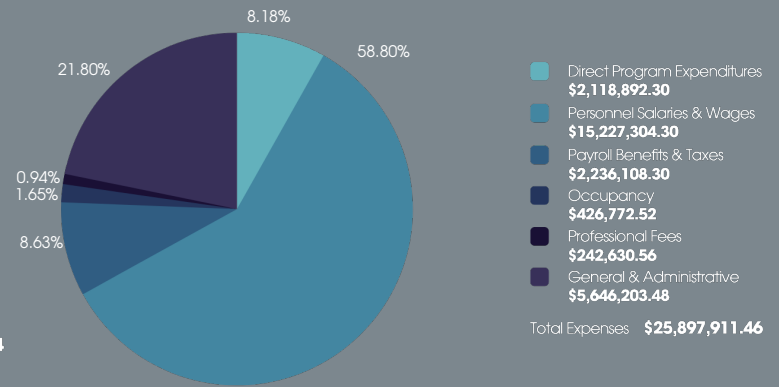

“Isaiah House Cares” Campaign

In preparation for a major gifts campaign, Isaiah House conducted its first Family Giving Campaign achieving 100% participation from all full-time staff.

2nd Chance Employment Expands

Isaiah House ancillary businesses, Reliance Works & Howard’s Metal Sales, increased job opportunities for people in recovery with new locations in Stanford, Beattyville, Irvine and Harrodsburg.

Shelley Center Opens

Shelley Center in Harrodsburg, KY opened in 2022. Named for Rita and the late C.A. Shelley, this addition increased our residential bed count for women to 122.

Thompson Center Opens

The opening of the new Dr. Larry Thompson Counseling & Education Center was celebrated in 2022 with special recognition for the late Dr. Thompson, one of Isaiah House’s first counselors.

Partnerships Grow

Isaiah House partnered with 17 other providers in 2022 to ensure access to substance use disorder treatment for anyone in need.

Advocate Spotlight



Pattie Vargas, an Isaiah House donor and advocate since 2021, is a Peer Parent Coach with the Partnership to End Addiction, CA State Rep for The Recovery Advocacy Project, a Certified Grief Professional, and a National Ambassador for Shatterproof, a nonprofit dedicated to reversing the addiction crisis. Her daughter, Rebekah, is a graduate of Isaiah House's Women's Treatment Center in Versailles, and is the On Site Lead Research Assistant for NET Recovery. After losing her son to addiction in 2017, Pattie was desperate to find a different approach to helping her daughter, who was also struggling with the disease. A CA resident, Pattie discovered Isaiah House after seeing the Netflix film, The Final Fix, which features Isaiah House as the site of clinical trials for the Net device, a neuro-electric therapy, non-medication treatment for substance use disorder. Pattie and Rebekah found new hope at Isaiah House, not only with successful treatment with the NET device but also a love and compassion that they had never experienced at eight previous treatment centers. "I was just broken and exhausted when I got Rebekah to Isaiah House, but it was a completely different situation. They say they will love you back to life, and that is exactly what they did." Pattie and Rebekah are featured speakers at the 2023 Isaiah House Annual Banquet. Pattie tells her family's story of grief and redemption in the newly released book, Secrets, Scars and Heart Shaped Jars.

Alumni Spotlight

Seven years ago, Jordan Wilson found himself at a crossroads sitting in a church pew on Easter Sunday. Addicted, Jordan begrudgingly agreed to go to Church for his dad. That day proved to be pivotal as he felt the spirit move him when the pastor followed his sermon with an ask for anyone who would like to give their heart to Christ to come forward. "I rushed down there and surrendered to Jesus," Jordan said. After that moment, Jordan found himself walking through the doors of Isaiah House. He would go on to complete the long-term program and began his career in ministry. Today, Jordan has been in recovery for seven years and serves as the Director of Development for Friends of Sinners – a nonprofit addiction treatment program in Owensboro, Ky and is the Youth Director for HIS Church in Henderson, Ky. Along with that, the Isaiah House graduate launched his own nonprofit, Jesus Ministries, and authored a book Jesus>Drugs that he has distributed to jails, prisons, and treatment providers across the United States. Jordan is also a proud husband and a father to two beautiful children. We are so proud of Jordan and his testimony that there is real hope for addiction!
