Isaiah House is leading a statewide effort to create a network of churches that support people in recovery in their communities. The program will engage and train faith-based organizations, with a goal to reduce the stigma of addiction and encourage people in recovery to live a life of faith and discipleship. In addition to training for church leaders, the program also connects graduates of treatment programs with welcoming and supportive home churches in their communities. SUPPORTING THE MINISTRY OF ISAIAH HOUSE

Prayers, advocacy, and generous giving from churches have played a vital role in Isaiah House's mission since its founding. Church contributions support client needs that cannot be met by insurance or traditional sources of revenue including:

- Clothing, coats, shoes, and hygiene products for indigent clients
- Christian literature, Bibles, and Celebrate Recovery materials.
- Salaries for chaplains who provide faith-based counseling and spiritual guidance
- Transportation to jobs, church services, and community service projects
- "Family Days" when clients have the opportunity to reconnect with loved ones
- Support for clients moving from residential treatment to sober living homes, where they continue receiving support in their recovery.
- Sober social activities that help clients learn to enjoy a life free of addiction.
